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ROCK CLIMBING - TRAD CLIMBING BASICS COURSE

The Mont Blanc massif is renowned worldwide for the quality of its climbing routes. Until the end of the 1970s, pitons were the primary means of belaying on these routes, as they were the only available equipment in Europe at that time. While highly effective, pitons came with logistical challenges (weight, type, hammer, etc.). The rise of free climbing gradually led to the widespread use of natural protections like stoppers, nuts, and especially cams, which are well-suited for cracks. Cams are relatively lightweight, easy to place and remove, and do not impede the climber's movement. They are the most commonly used equipment in trad climbing today.

In this course, you will climb in small groups of three or four at most, under the direct supervision of a guide, ensuring high-quality personalized instruction. This trad climbing basics course will introduce you to climbing on non-bolted routes that require the use of removable equipment, such as cams. You will learn essential techniques and safe cam usage. The program focuses on pedagogy specifically designed for learning trad climbing. This climbing course is intended for individuals with prior experience in multi-pitch routes and the ability to climb at least French grade 5c.

The objectives of the Trad climbing basics course

- -Introduction to the use of protective equipment, including nuts, stoppers, and cams
- -Learning the typical techniques for climbing cracks.
- -Developing the skills needed for independent climbing and leading pitches at levels 4 and 5.

ITINERARY

Day 1

Brévent foothills crag site

The best crag site for an introductory session. Already bolted, cams can still be used for a safe discovery of the basics.

Day 2

Peigne foothills crag site

In the foothills of the Papillons Ridge, a site dedicated to trad climbing has recently been equipped. The belays are in place; it's up to you to do the rest!

EQUIPMENT

We recommend you take particular care over you choice of equipment, as it plays a large role in the success of your trip.

Technical equipment

- Light hiking shoes
- Comfortable rock-climbing shoes, magnesia, harness, helmet
- Belay device, slings, self-locking device for rappelling, screws carabineers
- Bring the extra technical gear you have (quickdraws, rope, cams...)
- Light bag pack

Clothing

- Waterproof and windproof, non-insulated parka with hood (Gore-tex or equivalent)
- Windproof, non-insulated pant
- 1 short (depending on conditions)
- Thick polar-pile fleece jacket or equivalent
- 1 long-sleeve shirt

Accessories

- High-altitude sunglasses (grade 3 is recommended),
- 1.0 or 1.5 quart water bottle (insulate if possible),
- Sun block for face and lips,
- 1 pocketknife,
- Camera
